#### **FFY25 Byrne/JAG grant application**

- **Funding Total:** DCJS submitted to the Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA), within the U.S. Department of Justice, for funding under the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program for Federal Fiscal Year (FY) 2025. The total amount requested is **\$4,149,031**.
- **Purpose Areas:** Funds made available through the JAG Program play a critical role in supporting the Commonwealth's efforts to address evolving challenges across the criminal justice system. DCJS proposes to utilize FY 2025 JAG funding to support. DCJS will use these funds to support: Violent Crime Reduction and Gun Violence Prevention; Law Enforcement Capacity, Effectiveness, and Community Trust; Local Law Enforcement Block Grant Program (LOLE); Equipment, Technology and Training; Substance Use, Drug Enforcement, and Overdose Prevention; Enhancing Services for

Victims of Crime; Evidence-Based Practices; Prosecution and Courts; Prevention and Education; Corrections and Community Corrections; Drug Treatment and Enforcement; Planning, Evaluation, and Technology Improvement; and Mental Health and Crisis Intervention Programs.
