Requirements & Best Practices for Use of Guidance Documents



Office of Regulatory Management June 2023 (Updated October 2024)

This document provides information for Virginia agencies on when and how to use guidance documents and on possible alternatives to the use of guidance documents.

What qualifies as a guidance document?

The Virginia Code defines "guidance document" as "any document developed by a state agency or staff that provides information or guidance of general applicability to the staff or public to interpret or implement statutes or the agency's rules or regulations." It goes on to say that "documents that pertain only to the internal management of agencies" are not considered to be guidance documents (§ 2.2-4101).

Not every document that Virginia agencies issue counts as a guidance document that goes through a public comment process (§ 2.2-4002.1) and is subject to review by the Office of Regulatory Management (ORM) (Youngkin Executive Order 19). When you are deciding whether a particular document qualifies as a guidance document subject to ORM review, you should ask three questions:

- (1) Does the document relate to interpretation or implementation of statute or the agency's regulations? If not, it does not meet the definition of a guidance document.
- (2) Does the document announce a generally applicable policy? If it relates only to a specific party (e.g., an email notice to a company) or a one-time transaction (e.g., notice of an upcoming meeting), it does not qualify as a guidance document.
- (3) Does the document apply to or affect anyone outside the agency (including other state agencies)? If a document applies exclusively to matters internal to the agency, it is not considered a guidance document. Agencies may, however, consider posting internal documents that may be of public interest on their websites (rather than the Virginia Regulatory Town Hall) for purposes of transparency.

If the answer to these three questions is "yes," then the document qualifies as a guidance document for purpose of ORM review regardless of the form or it takes or how it is titled. Though it is impossible to provide a comprehensive list of materials that do or do not qualify as guidance documents, ORM has identified some classes of documents for which agencies might be unsure as to whether they qualify:

¹ Though these do not qualify as guidance documents, many of them may be of public interest and may be good candidates for listing on the agency's website and/or posting as "general notices" on the Virginia Regulatory Town Hall.

² Forms that regulated parties are required to complete must be included in the corresponding regulation and cannot be issued as guidance documents. 1 VAC 7-10-180.

Agencies should carefully review each guidance document to ensure it conforms to the statutory definition at § 2.2-4101. All agency guidance documents should be posted on the Regulatory Town Hall (https://townhall.virginia.gov/L/GDocs.cfm), and these should match the documents listed by the Office of the Registrar (https://register.dls.virginia.gov/guidancedocs.aspx). Only those documents that meet the statutory definition should be posted on the Town Hall.

If your agency has questions about whether a particular document is best classified as a regulation, guidance document, or something else, please contact ORM and, as applicable, the Office of the Attorney General (OAG). ORM will work with you to decide how the document should be classified and whether it should be submitted for ORM review. OAG can provide legal guidance on whether the document is subject to the Administrative Process Act and what procedures your agency should follow in issuing it.

Can an agency set requirements via guidance documents?

No. Only statutes and regulations have the force of law. (Virginia Code § 2.2-4101) Guidance documents cannot be enforced by the agency.

Agencies should also avoid setting requirements via guidance document for reasons of transparency. The Administrative Process Act (APA) includes various procedures that create an open and accountable process for the development of regulations. It is important that any document imposing a requirement go through this process. In addition, the Virginia Administrative Code (VAC) compiles all regulations in a single place. It is far easier for the public to find regulatory requirements in the VAC than to sort through an agency's guidance documents on its website or on Town Hall.

In no instance should an agency set or modify a *fee* (e.g., licensing fee, exam fee) via a guidance document rather than a regulation. An agency may, however, disclose a schedule or list of potential *penalties or fines* (including ranges) in order to provide transparency in an enforcement program. This is a permissible use of a guidance document, since the agency is simply announcing in advance how it will use its discretion rather than setting a new requirement. Such announcements should always occur via either regulation or guidance document, however, and should not be announced via a communication that does not undergo ORM review or receive public comment.

How should an agency proceed if it needs to act quickly?

As noted above, it is perfectly acceptable for an agency to *describe* a statutory or regulatory requirement via a guidance document or general notice. In that light, if an agency needs to quickly communicate a change in law, such as a new requirement imposed by the General Assembly, it is perfectly permissible to use a guidance document or general notice for that purpose.

If an agency needs to create *new requirements* that go beyond what is contained in statutes or regulations, however, it should not use a guidance document. If it needs to act quickly, it should instead consider the following options for promulgating regulations in short order:

ORM is aware that, in the past, the regulatory process would often take months or even years to complete, in large measure as a result of extensive delays in the executive review process. A major part of ORM's mission is reducing those review times, and it has already reduced the average review time in the Governor's Office from 241 days to 12 days (as of the date of this memorandum).

Agencies will, of course, need to build in time for public comment and publication in the Registrar (as is also true of guidance documents), as appropriate. But the overall process could

theoretically be completed in a matter of 3–4 months in the case of a fast-track action and an even shorter period of time in the case of an emergency or exempt regulation.

Of course, in cases in which it is operating under a compressed timeframe, the agency should communicate that information to (as applicable) OAG, DPB, the relevant Secretary, and ORM as soon as possible so that they can plan accordingly.

What is the ORM process for review of guidance documents?

When an agency makes a substantive change to a guidance document (including rescinding it entirely) or reconsiders an existing guidance document and decides to reissue it as is, the agency should submit the document to ORM for review. If, by contrast, the agency makes a technical edit to a guidance document, such as fixing a grammatical error or reformatting it, ORM does not need to review it. The chart below summarizes the types of actions ORM does and does not review.

ORM Will Review	ORM Will Not Review
Reissuance of guidance document(s)	Fixing grammatical errors (i.e., typos)
Repeal of guidance document(s)	Modifications to formatting (i.e., incorrect page numbers)
Changes to the scope of guidance coverage	Fixing broken links for internal agency or external references

Deletion of unnecessary verbiage	

If an agency believes that a guidance document falls into the "ORM Will Not Review" category, it should contact ORM Special Assistant Ariana He (<u>Ariana.He1@governor.virginia.gov</u>). She will let the agency know whether ORM concurs in the conclusion that the document does not require review. If it does, the agency can submit the document to Melanie West (melanie.west@dpb.virginia.gov) in the Department of Planning and Budget, who will help the agency post the document to Town Hall.

If the guidance document requires ORM review, the agency should follow the instructions attached as an "Appendix" to this document. When ORM has completed its review, the agency will receive an auto-generated email from the Town Hall website. The agency should then submit the guidance document to the Registrar. Once submitted, the guidance document will undergo a 30-day public comment period.

After the comment period has ended, the agency is free to finalize the guidance document if it did not make any additional changes. If it did make changes, it should resubmit the document

for a second round of ORM review. For the time being, the agency should resubmit the revised document and the updated ORM Economic Review Form by emailing them to ORM Director Reeve Bull (Reeve.Bull@governor.virginia.gov) and Special Assistant Ariana He (Ariana.He1@governor.virginia.gov). Future changes will modify the Town Hall submission forum to allow the agency to resubmit a final revised guidance document for ORM review.



Guidance Document Forums on the Virginia Regulatory Town Hall

Notice: These instructions are expected to be revised in the next few months after additional changes are made to Town Hall website.

These instructions outline the various steps, choices, and options available to you when managing a public comment forum for changes to guidance documents. These instructions are designed for executive branch agencies that are subject to review by the Office of Regulatory Management (ORM). All changes made to guidance documents must be approved by ORM, and executive branch agencies should only change a guidance document by using the public comment forum process outlined in these instructions. This process has been designed to facilitate compliance with § 2.2-4002.1 of the Code of Virginia, which requires public comment forums for guidance documents.


These instructions consist of four parts:

- 1. Where to find your guidance document public comment forums (page 1).
- 2. Considerations before you start a guidance document public comment forum (page 2).
- 3. How to start a public comment forum, submit it to ORM for review, and then submit it for publication in the *Virginia Register of Regulations* (page 3).
- 4. After the guidance document public comment forum closes (page 11).

Where to find your guidance document public comment forums

On the Agency Functions dropdown list at the top of the menu bar, select "My Guidance Documents."

You will then see the screen below, including the link to "Start Guidance Document Forum (per § 2.2-4002.1)." If you need to take action on an existing guidance document public comment forum, click on "Manage My Comment Forums."



Considerations before you start a guidance document public comment forum

If you have more than one guidance document to add, change, or delete, please carefully consider whether this is best accomplished in a single comment forum or whether you should open multiple forums.

Are the Changes Similar?

If you are making similar or related changes (e.g., you are changing contact information), it may make sense to group all the guidance documents in one public comment forum because the comments would all be addressing the same change in each guidance document.

If you are making different changes to different documents, it may be preferable to open a separate forum for each guidance document, for clarity and in order to avoid confusion. Otherwise, you may not know which guidance document a comment pertains to.

Will Your Response to Comments Be Similar?

Once the public comment period has closed for a forum, you will have to select one of three options (i.e., decide whether to retain the effective date, to delay the effective date for 30 days, or to abandon/withdraw all of the proposed changes). These options are discussed on page 11.

The choice you make will apply to <u>ALL</u> of the guidance documents in a single public comment forum. The design of Town Hall does not allow the ability to apply different choices to different guidance documents (e.g., make some guidance documents effective, while delaying the effective date of other guidance documents), so it is especially important to be thoughtful and consider the ramifications if you include several guidance documents within a single comment forum.

How to start a public comment forum, submit it to ORM for review, and then submit it for publication in the *Virginia Register of Publication*

Once you have selected "Start Guidance Document Forum (per § 2.2-4002.1)", you will see a screen with five steps (as indicated below).

You must complete each step before you can proceed to the next step, and all five steps must be completed before you can submit your proposed guidance document changes to the Virginia *Register of Regulations (Register)* for publication and the opening of the public comment forum on Town Hall on the date of publication. After the forum concludes, you need to finalize the proposed changes. At a high level, the pre-publication process consists of the following:

- 1. Step 1, describe the proposed changes.
- 2. Step 2, identify the guidance documents that will be added, amended, or deleted; this may require you to upload a new or amended document(s).
- 3. Step 3, verify the contact information for the public comment forum.
- 4. Step 4. submit the ORM Economic Review Form and the proposed changes to ORM for Review.
- 5. Step 5, after ORM review, submit the proposed changes to the *Register* for publication. A 30-day public comment forum will begin when the changes are published.

After the comment forum closes, you will have to take two steps:

- 1. Step 1, select one of three options: retain the current effective date and/or delete the guidance document proposed to be deleted; delay the effective date for 30 days; or withdraw (or abandon) the proposed changes in their entirety and leave the guidance document(s) "as is."
- 2. Step 2, either make effective the proposed document that appeared in the forum or upload a revised document for ORM review.

Step 1 requires you to briefly describe the nature of the changes you will be making to your guidance documents. Once you are finished, click the "Save" button, which will appear as soon as you start typing in the text box. Note that you can further edit this description at any time before submitting the forum to the *Register*.


Step 2 requires you to identify the guidance document(s) that will change and upload the proposed guidance document(s), if applicable. Specifically, you will have two options:

- 1. Select an existing document to update or delete (see page 4), or
- 2. Add a brand new guidance document (see page 7).


These instructions will describe how to use each option, beginning with selecting an existing document to update or delete.

Option 1: select an existing document to update or delete

1. To update or delete an existing document, click "Select Existing Document" as illustrated on the screen below.




2. Next, a list of all your guidance documents will appear, as shown in the next image.



- 3. To the left of each guidance document will be a checkbox. Click the checkbox next to each guidance document that you wish to update or delete.
- 4. To save your work, be sure to click the "Save" button at the bottom of this page.


(Notice how two of the guidance documents on the screen above cannot be selected. This is because these guidance documents are currently being changed in another public comment forum.)

After clicking the "Save" button, you will be returned to the previous screen, which will now look similar to the one below. The document(s) you selected will now be displayed under the "Document in Effect" column.




The next step is to complete the "Proposed Document" column. Here you have two options as indicated below:

- 1. <u>Upload Doc</u>: If you plan to replace the existing guidance document that you just selected, then you should click on "Upload Doc."
- 2. <u>Intend to Delete</u>: If you plan to delete the existing guidance document that you just selected, then you should click on "Intend to Delete."

See the red x at the end of each row? You may use this to delete a row in case you make a mistake. Then you can then click on "Add New Document" to start over. You can make edits like this until you submit the public comment forum to ORM for review.

Option 2: Add a Brand New Guidance Document

If you are issuing a brand new guidance document, and are not replacing or deleting an existing one, then click on "Add New Document" as shown below in red:

Step 3 requires you to verify that the contact information for the public comment forum is correct. If it is, you do not need to do anything. If it needs to be changed, select "No" and enter the correct information.

At this point, please make sure everything about this forum looks correct, because uploading the ORM Economic Review Form in the next step will also automatically submit this forum to ORM for review.

Step 4 requires you to Upload the ORM Economic Review Form. If your screen does not look like the image below, then look at your work in Step 2 to ensure this step has been completed.

<u>Upload the ORM Economic Review Form</u> for the Governor's Office of Regulatory Management review.

After clicking on the link to upload the ORM Economic Review Form you will be taken to another screen to select the ORM Economic Review Form. Note, when you submit this ORM Economic Review Form, this forum will automatically be submitted to the Governor's Office of Regulatory Management for review.


The image below shows the screen after uploading the ORM Economic Review Form.

Once ORM has approved your guidance document changes, your screen will look like the image below and you can proceed to Step 5.

Step 5 occurs after ORM review, and requires you to complete the *Register* publication information and submit the forum for publication. It will default to the next publication date but you can select a future publication date if needed. (This works very similar to the process of submitting a regulatory stage to the *Register* for publication.) Note: In compliance with Code § 2.2-4002.1, the default effective date will be set as the 31st day after publication, but you can make it later if you wish.

The image below shows Step 5 after ORM has approved the forum




Before you can submit the forum to the Registrar, a pop up box will appear (pictured below). You will need to click this box to certify that any proposed guidance document conforms to the definition of a guidance document in § 2.2-4101. This is a legal requirement in § 2.2-4002.1 of the Code of Virginia.



The 30-day public comment forum

Five days before notice of the guidance document public comment forum is published in the *Register*, notification will automatically be sent out to Town Hall registered public users. Public comment forums for guidance documents operate and can be managed in the same way as those opened for regulatory proposals. When a public comment forum opens on Town Hall, the Guidance Document Forum page will look like the screen below.

After the public comment forum closes

Immediately after the public comment forum closes, you have to complete two final steps in order to complete the process. At a high level, these steps are:


- 1. Step 1: choose from one of three options: retain or change the effective date, delete a document that you indicated would be deleted, or abandon all changes and leave any existing guidance documents "as is. (page 11).
- 2. Step 2: finalize the forum by taking final action on each guidance document. This involves deciding whether to make the proposed guidance document (the one that was part of the forum) your final guidance document, or whether to instead use a revised guidance document. Note: if you have identified a need to upload a revised document, you must first email the document and an ORM Economic Review Form to ORM for review (page 14).

Step 1 requires you to choose one of three options:

- 1. Retain the current effective date and/or delete the guidance document proposed to be deleted;
- 2. Delay the effective date for 30 days; or
- 3. Withdraw (or abandon) the proposed changes in their entirety and leave the guidance document(s) "as is." This will leave the guidance document just as it was before the forum began.

Please be advised that you need to make the same decision for all your documents in the forum. (See the Appendix for factors to consider when determining whether to put multiple documents in one public comment forum.)

You can make your choice by clicking on the corresponding link (highlighted in the red box on the screen below).




Option 1: Retain the current effective date and/or delete the guidance document that was proposed to be deleted.

Under option 1 you have two choices. If you are adding or amending a guidance document, you can chose to retain the effective date of the document (the date you entered before the forum began). Or, if you intend to delete the guidance document, you can proceed with deletion.

If you decide to retain the effective date of your guidance document, your screen will look something like this:



If you have proposed to delete a guidance document, your screen will look something like this:



Option 2: Delay the effective date for 30 days.


Option 2 applies if you are adding or amending a guidance document, but you need to extend the effective date per § 2.2-4002.1 of the Code of Virginia. If you choose a 30-day delay for the effective date of your guidance document, your screen will look something like this:



After the 30-day delay, you will need to finalize your guidance document, as described in Step 2 below.

Option 3: Withdraw the changes proposed to your guidance document.


If you choose to abandon or withdraw all the changes associated with the public comment forum, the screen will look something like this:



Note that the forum will continue to be on the Town Hall website even if the proposed changes are withdrawn.

Step 2 requires you to **take final action** on each guidance document. <u>You should make these changes as close to the effective date as possible in order to avoid confusion</u>. If you are creating a new guidance document or amending an existing document, follow these directions:

As indicated by the options circled in red below, you can either make effective the proposed document that appeared in the forum by clicking on "Make Proposed the Current," or you can select the option to "Upload a Revised Document" which would be the original proposed document with additional changes made in response to public comment. See the red box below for an example.



Note: if you have identified a need to upload a revised document, do <u>not</u> create a new forum. Instead, you must submit the revised document and an ORM Economic Review Form to ORM for review. Because this process is not currently available on Town Hall, you should submit the revised document and ORM Economic Review Form to ORM via email to Reeve Bull (<u>Reeve.Bull@governor.virginia.gov</u>) and Ariana He (<u>Ariana.He1@governor.virginia.gov</u>). A future update will allow this to be done via Town Hall.

After you receive ORM approval, you can post the revised guidance document.

Once you make your choice, the screen will change to show that the guidance document has been updated. See the red box below for an example. (Note, the screen looks the same regardless of which choice you made.)
